

Public Works is proposing a 4.5% in 2021 for Single Family Residential, Multi-family, Commercial and Industrial rates. The predominant cost drivers for these increases include increases in Johnson County Wastewater and debt service payments, as well as, increasing costs to rehabilitate and replace aging infrastructure in both operations and maintenance budgets and capital projects.

The fiscal impact on the average single-family residence (service fee and consumption) will increase from \$45.23 per month in 2020 to \$47.30 in 2021. The table below shows Olathe's 2021 rate compared to all other known 2021 rates and 2020 published rates.



Public Works is proposing to increase rates by 3.5% in 2021 for Single Family Residential, Multi-family, Commercial and Industrial rates. The predominant cost drivers for these increases are debt service payments as well as increasing costs to rehabilitate and replace aging infrastructure in both Operations and Maintenance budgets and Capital Projects.

The fiscal impact on the average single-family residence (service fee and consumption) will increase from \$40.27 per month in 2020 to \$41.27 in 2021.

The City of Olathe negotiates wholesale contracts for Water Districts. The current fee is \$3.06/100 cubic feet in 2020. If not otherwise contracted with the City, Public Works is proposing to raise the rate, including the service charge for water meters by 10% in 2021.



It has been identified that there is a significant shortcoming on cost recovery related to the ROW fees. While many Cities have adjusted their fees to recover a large percentage of their cost, Olathe has not adopted the fee structure of many of their neighbors.

The City recovers approximately 10% of their costs in the current Right of Way fee structure. Public Works is proposing an increase in the permit fee from \$50 per permit to \$50 per adjacent parcel.





Often, a new business will move into an existing space and not undertake any construction requiring a building permit. In order to issue a Certificate of Occupancy, the City must perform an inspection to verify the space meets the adopted codes for the proposed use. The Fire Department performs this inspection and issues documents under an Occupancy Permit application.

Currently there is not a fee specifically for occupancy permits, so businesses are issued as a Class V commercial remodel permit at the minimum fee of \$100.00. This causes confusion because customers are not able to determine the fees in the existing construction fee schedule.

The Fire Department is proposing a fee specifically for occupancy permits at \$100.00. This clarifies the current practice, and the fee is consistent with surrounding cities. The Occupancy fees for both Leawood and Lenexa is \$100. Other surrounding cities incorporate the fee into business license fees.
